"All of your commands can be trusted." Ps.119:86

"All Scripture is God-breathed..." 2 Tim. 3:16-17

"God-breathed" in Greek is theopneustos. Theo, meaning God, pneustos, meaning breathed. Scripture is the voice (word) of God.

But apart from the Bible how do I know the Bible is the Word of God (trustworthy)?

There are seven reasons why you can trust the Bible...

1. It is historically accurate.

So how do we know that the Bible is historically accurate? You apply the tests/standards of good history.

The Bible is primarily eyewitness accounts.

Extreme care and attention to accuracy were used in passing scriptures from one generation to another.

Scribes and copyists had a long list of rules they had to go by to make sure it was exact.

Archeology proves the accuracy of the Bible.

Luke, the author of Acts was a historian.

When archaeology has seemingly contradicted the Bible over time and with new discoveries the Bible has been vindicated.

Example: The Hittites.
