
Title: By Understanding How It

- 1. The Bible recreates my life,
- 2. it eradicates my guilt,
- 3. it activates my faith. And it...

4. STIMULATES MY GROWTH.

An inheritance is what you get for being part of a family.

When you trust Jesus for salvation, you're not just a "believer". You're a "belonger".

There are family responsibilities and there are family privileges.

God wants to stimulate your growth and give you an inheritance.

The purpose of the Bible is to help you live out the purpose God has for your life.

The Bible does this by four things.

a. **TEACHING** is God showing me the path to walk on.

- b. REBUKING is when God shows me how I got off the path, and ended up in a ditch.
- c. CORRECTING is God telling me how I get back on the right path.
- d. And TRAINING is how I stay on the path and not fall into the ditch again.

5. **ILLUMINATES** MY MIND.

When you illuminate something you shine a light on it.

God wants to bring light/understanding to every area of our lives.

Sometimes enlightenment happens immediately. But more often the light comes like the dawn.

Often the way it happens is when we meditate on the Word.

"I have more insight than all my teachers for I meditate on your statutes." Psalm 119:99

Meditating is like soaking your mind in the Word.

When God turns the light on it helps you to know what to do,/how to respond.

"Your Word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Psalm 119:105

God's Word is like a lamp that gives just enough light for the next step.

To turn the light on in your life pray prayers related to God's Word. Example: "Open my eyes / that I may see / wonderful things / in your law." Psalm 119:18
