## 5. APPLICATION.

You only believe the parts of the Bible you actually do.

"Don't deceive yourselves. Don't merely listen to the word and so deceive yourselves. Do what it says." James 1:22.

In application you do three things.

- 1. Picture it. What's it look like in your mind?
- 2. Pronounce it.

Nine questions to ask about any text.

- 1. Is there a sin to confess?
- 2. *Is there a promise to claim?*
- 3. Is there an attitude to change?
- 4. Is there a command to obey?
- 5. Is there an example to follow?
- 6. Is there a prayer to pray in this verse?

- 7. *Is there an error to avoid?*
- 8. *Is there a truth to believe?*
- 9. Is there something I can thank God for?

Make a Pronouncement (write it out) about what you are going to do. That action plan needs to be personal, practical, possible, provable, and set a date as the goal for when you will accomplish it. Write it down.

Example: "Honor those like this." Look for ways to thank/honor the people who have been Godly examples in your life.

Example: Of the five characteristics of a godly person, which one am I the weakest on?
