"If anyone doesn't remain in me, he's like a branch that's thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned." John 15:6

Rules of Interpretation...

- 1. Consider the historical context.
- 2. Define the key words.
- 3. Interpret unclear verses with clear ones.
- 4. Look for the most obvious meaning.

The purpose of a fruit tree is to bear fruit. Branches disconnected from the fruit tree are no good, except for firewood.

"If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask whatever you wish, and it will be given to you!" John 5:7 He's talking about prayer.

1. Remaining in Christ produces answered prayers.

Prayer can do anything that God can do!

You can thank God for unanswered prayer because God, in His infinite wisdom, has something better in mind.

When you pray, don't ask God for what *you* think is good for you. Ask God for what *He* thinks is good for you.

"I will do whatever you ask in my name, so that the Son may bring glory to the Father. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it." (14:13)

2. Answered prayer brings glory to God.

When I pray and ask for things and then God gives it to me, it brings glory to God because it shows how loving God is.

"Until now you have not asked for anything in my name. Ask and you will receive, and your joy will be complete!" (16:24)

3. Answered prayer gives me complete joy!

Over twenty times in the New Testament we are commanded to ask. "You have not because you ask not." James

Jesus, in his final words says, I want you to ask in prayer. When you don't pray, you don't hurt God, you hurt yourself.

BEARING FRUIT

comes by remaining in Christ, brings glory to God, gives me complete joy.

ANSWERED PRAYER

comes from remaining in Christ, brings glory to God, gives me complete joy.

"You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit-fruit that will last. Then the Father will give you whatever you ask in my name!" (15:16)

I bear fruit by asking in prayer. Prayer is the password to everything God wants to do in your life.

God does not want prayer to be your spare tire. He wants it to be the steering wheel.

Much prayer, much fruit. Little prayer, little fruit. No prayer, no fruit.
