The fifth statement Jesus made from the cross shows Jesus' humanity, but much more is embodied in these words.

"After this, Jesus knew that everything had been completed. So that the Scripture would come true, he said, 'I am thirsty.' There was a jar full of vinegar there, so the soldiers soaked a sponge in it, put the sponge on a branch of a hyssop plant, and lifted it to Jesus' mouth." John 19:28&29

"I thirst" shows...

## 1. Jesus is really human.

Jesus was fully God and He was also fully human.

"Jesus gave up his place with God and made himself nothing. He was born to be a man and he became a servant. When he was living as a man, he humbled himself and was fully obedient to God, even when that caused his death on the cross." Philippians 2:7&8

## 2. Jesus is the promised Savior.

"So that the Scriptures would come true, Jesus said 'I am thirsty.""

For hundreds of years God gave the Jews prophesies concerning the Messiah.

For Jesus to be who he claimed to be He would have to fulfill every one of those prophecies.

There is one last prophecy to be fulfilled, a prophecy about the Messiah being given vinegar to drink.

What the soldiers offered Jesus was *pasca*, a standard drink for Roman soldiers.

*Pasca* was wine that had turned into wine vinegar. They would take this wine that was sour and mix it with water and add herbs to make it tasty.

They gave it to Jesus by soaking a sponge in it and putting it on a hyssop stick, lifting it up to Jesus' mouth.

"Take a branch of the hyssop plant, dip it in the bowl filled with blood, then wipe the blood on the sides and tops of the doorframes." Exodus 12:22 (NCV)
