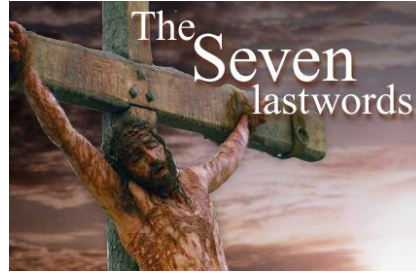

When he had received the drink, Jesus said, ‘It is finished!’” John 19:28-30

HE FULFILLED _____.

“This is what I told you while I was still with you: Everything must be fulfilled that is written about me in the Law of Moses, the Prophets, and the Psalms. Then he opened their minds so they could understand the Scriptures. He told them, ‘This is what is written: The Christ will suffer and rise from the dead on the third day, and repentance and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.’” Luke 24:44-47

HE SATISFIED _____.

“But God put into effect a different plan to save us. He sent his own Son in a human body like ours, except that ours is sinful. God destroyed sin’s control over us by giving his Son as a sacrifice for our sins. And he did this so that the requirement of the law would be fully accomplished for us who no longer follow our sinful nature but instead follow the Spirit.” Romans 8:3-4 (NLT) “He canceled the record that contained the charges against us. He took it and destroyed it by nailing it to Christ’s cross.” Colossians 2:14 (NLT)

“God’s Son paid the price to free us, which means that our sins are forgiven.” Colossians 1:14

In the ancient Greek tetelestai was a _____.
