"Honor your father and your mother, so that you may live long in the land the LORD your God is giving you. Exodus 20:12

"Sharper than a serpent's tooth is a thankless child." - William Shakespeare

For most of us here it comes **<u>natural</u>**.

This is the only commandment that has an accompanying promise.

Behind many of God's promises there are principles and values that are **just as valid** for every succeeding generation of followers.

It is my conviction that this promise yields more **<u>blessing</u>** than most of us realize or could ever imagine.

- your quality of life
- <u>spiritual maturity</u>
- a more <u>meaningful</u> relationship with your parents
- your parents experiencing desired approval and affirmation
- the elderly receiving the honor and dignity they deserve
- the <u>survival</u> of our nation

"barely half of the American public believes it is the children's responsibility to look after their parents as they become aged."

As a culture we are <u>schizophrenic</u> at best when it comes to honoring our parents.

"What is honored in a land will be cultivated there." Plato

"Honor" = "High **public esteem**, fame, glory; to earn a position of honor."

In Hebrew, *honor* means "heavy" or "weight". Its literal meaning was "to lay on them". Thus, "I weigh you down with respect and prestige. I place upon you great worth and value."

This command is not **age sensitive**.

Honoring your parents does not mean endorsing their **irresponsibility** or sin or denying what they have **done wrong**.

Honoring parents does mean:

- Choosing to **place great value** on your relationship with them.
- Taking the initiative to **<u>improve</u>** your relationship.
- **<u>Obeying</u>** them until you are established as an adult.
- Recognizing what they've done **<u>right</u>** in your life.
- Recognizing the <u>sacrifices</u> they have made for you.
- Praising them for the <u>legacy</u> they are passing on to you.
- Seeing them through the **eves of Christ**, with understanding and compassion.
- **<u>Forgiving them</u>** as Christ has forgiven you.
