Title: One is a Whole Number Text: Genesis 2:18; Mark 3:31-35 Topic: Singleness; Relationships

A commonly held view is that marriage is best. The flip side of that, is that singles are incomplete, unfinished, less than whole.

"The Lord God said, "It is not good for the man to be alone." Genesis 2:18 We've made this out to say something it was not intended to say.

All human beings need deep caring relationships and cannot live alone, but that is not to say that everyone should be married.

In Mark 3:31-35 Jesus gives a new view of relationships: Your spiritual bond with a person can be deeper, and more significant than you blood bond.

Biblical Characters who were single: Anna, John the Baptist, Jesus, Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. Paul was not only single, but he says in I Corinthians7:7 "I wish that all men were as I am."

Guidelines for those who are single and those who are not:

FOR SINGLES:

- 1. Seek God's total plan for your life.
- 2. Live with quality now.
- 3. Cultivate deep, caring relationships.
- 4. Be cautious about marrying, particularly if you are unhappy with your present state. "No marriage" is better than a "bad marriage."
- 5. Stay morally and sexually pure.

FOR MARRIED COUPLES:

- 1. Value the single person.
- 2. Develop sensitivity toward singles.
- 3. Integrate singles into the full fellowship of the church.
- 4. Include singles into your social circles.

Digging Deeper: In Mark 3:31-35 Why was Jesus family worried about Him? What did the crowd expect? What did Jesus say is the basis for a family relationship with Him? Is doing God's will an action or a belief?

For Further Reflection: What would be true of a Kingdom where the King viewed his subjects as his brothers and sisters? How does that reflect Jesus' relationship with you?
