"Let us not become weary in doing good. For at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up." Galatians 6:9

Many of us abandon our dreams because of the **harsh realities** of life.

When we stop dreaming something within us <u>dies</u>.

During discouraging circumstances, how can we dare to dream again? Understand how God desires to use obstacles to develop a persistent faith. There is a specific pattern or process that God takes us through in the fulfillment of our dreams.

DREAM: When God wants to do something, he often starts with a dream.

- Noah: the dream of building an ark.
- Abraham: the dream of being the father of a great nation.
- David: the dream of being the king.

<u>DECISION:</u> A dream is worthless unless you **<u>choose</u>** to follow it.

The decision phase always involves letting go of **security**.

- Abraham had to let go of his homeland.
- Moses had to let go of a promising career in Pharaoh's court.

<u>DELAY:</u> God gives a dream but does not fulfill it immediately.

Noah waited <u>120</u> years for it to rain.

- Abraham waited **99** years for a son.
- Moses waited 40 years in the desert.
- Jesus waited <u>30</u> years to begin his ministry. that would only last 3 years.

The delay stage is for teaching us to **trust Him**.

DIFFICULTIES:

Are difficulties a part of God's plan? Ask...

Mary & Joseph, Moses, David, Joseph, Noah

DEAD END:

The situation deteriorates until it becomes an impossibility.

In scripture, it's a principle that's called the **Death of a Vision**.

God lead the children of Israel into a cul-de-sac as they fled the Egyptian Army. They were boxed in! The name of the place where they were trapped at the Red Sea was called "Baal-Zephon", which means, "God's hidden treasure."

Deliverance:

God supernaturally fulfills the dream.

Why does God allow dreams to die? Our <u>impossibilities</u> are God's <u>opportunities</u>.
