*I came so they can have real and eternal life, more and better life than they ever dreamed of.* John 10:10.

When people know they only have a few days to live they have **amazing clarity** about how they should spend their time.

When Jesus knew his life on earth was nearly over, He did what most of us would do, He focused on the things that were **most important**.

*Jesus knew that the time had come for Him to leave this world and go to the Father. Having loved His own who were in the world, He now showed them the full extent of His love.* John 13:1

If you knew you had just a few days to live how might your life be different?

There are some principles seen in the life of Christ during his last 30 days upon this earth that when applied to our lives enable us to really live life to the fullest.

*“I came so they can have real and eternal life, more and better life than they ever dreamed of.”* John 10:10. (Msg.) God wants you to live a passionate and purposeful life

Regret causes us to be **afraid** of God and to live our lives outside of his plan.

*“I was afraid and hid from you.”* Genesis 3:10

It’s the **little things** that we neglect to do that we most often have regrets about.

*“... how incredibly great His power is to help those who believe Him. It is that same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead....”* Eph 1:19-20a

The reality of death is a **universal experience** we all have in common.

Only a fool would go all through life **unprepared** for something he knows is inevitable.

*“Christ will live in you as you open the door and invite Him in.”* Ephesians 3:17

*“... We throw open our doors to God and discover at the same moment that He has already thrown open His door to us!”* Romans 5:1-2

It’s possible to live your life in such a way that when you come to the end you will have very few regrets.

The most powerful word in the English language is the word NOW. It’s mentioned twice in II Corinthians 6:2.

*“I tell you, NOW is the time of God’s favor, NOW is the day of salvation.”* II Corinthians 6:2 Put God first and do it NOW.
